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- Physical
- Technical
- Process

# Security and Integrity Measures – Physical

- Badge access controls
- Auditable security seals on equipment
- Ballot drop boxes
  - Made of thick, secure metal
  - Bolted to concrete
  - Individually keyed





# Security and Integrity Measures - Technical

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- Electronic voter check-in with near real-time updates
- Voter data is secured, and encrypted while in transit and at rest
- All votes are cast on paper ballots
- Pre- & post-election confirmation of voting system software version
- Vote tally system and scanners are not connected to the internet
- Intrusion detection/prevention systems in place



# Security and Integrity Measures – Process

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- Voter File Maintenance – regular and consistent
- Ballot Handling – Daily randomized routes, GPS tracking, radio communication with controlled chain of custody
- Signature verification of all vote-by-mail ballots
- Pre-election & post-election Logic and Accuracy tests
- 1% Manual Tally and Risk Limiting Audit
- Partnerships – Federal, State and Local law enforcement & DA





# Voter Registration File Maintenance

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- Perform all daily maintenance activities required by law
- Perform additional discretionary activities, including
  - Identification of duplicate voter registration files
  - Access third-party data to identify possible voter changes
  - Encourage voters to re-register to update their information and signature
- **Performance Measurements:**
  - 57,677 voters cancelled in 2022
  - Only 2.67% of ballots mailed in 2022 General Election returned as undeliverable



# Security and Integrity – People

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- Background checks on all employees
- Extensive training provided to all employees
- Two-person integrity for movement of ballots
- Use of DA investigators, Sheriff's deputies, and security officers
- Command Center/Vote Center Help Desk
- Rapid deployment teams

# State Mandates

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- Mail a ballot to all active registered voters
- Have mail ballot drop-off locations
- Voting starts 29 days before Election Day
- Check ID of some first-time voters
- Voters may authorize anyone to return ballot



# Ballots Counted – 2022 General Election

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The number of ballots counted was not more than the number of voters who cast ballots.

- Ballots counted - 994,227
- Each ballot was comprised of two or three sheets
- Ballot sheets counted – 1,949,107
- Voters may cast all or some of their ballot sheets

## Cast Vote Record

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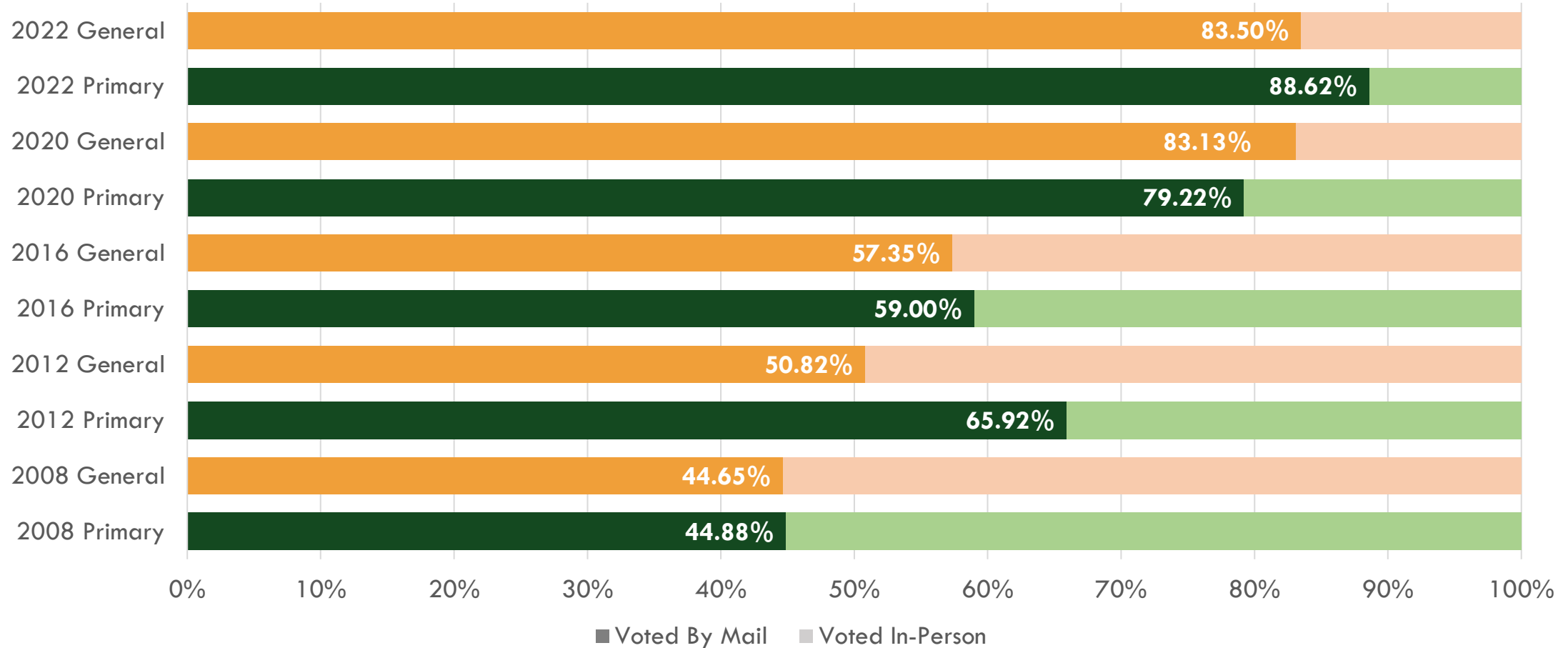
# Ballot Processing Time – 2022 General Election

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- 830,000 (83%) of voters cast Vote-By-Mail ballots
- 311,000 (37%) of VBM ballots cast on Election Day
- After a VBM ballot envelope is scanned, it can take at least two days before the votes are in the results
- 442,000 (85%) of VBM ballots received before Election Day were in the Election Night Results
- 882,000 (89%) of all ballots in results within 7 days

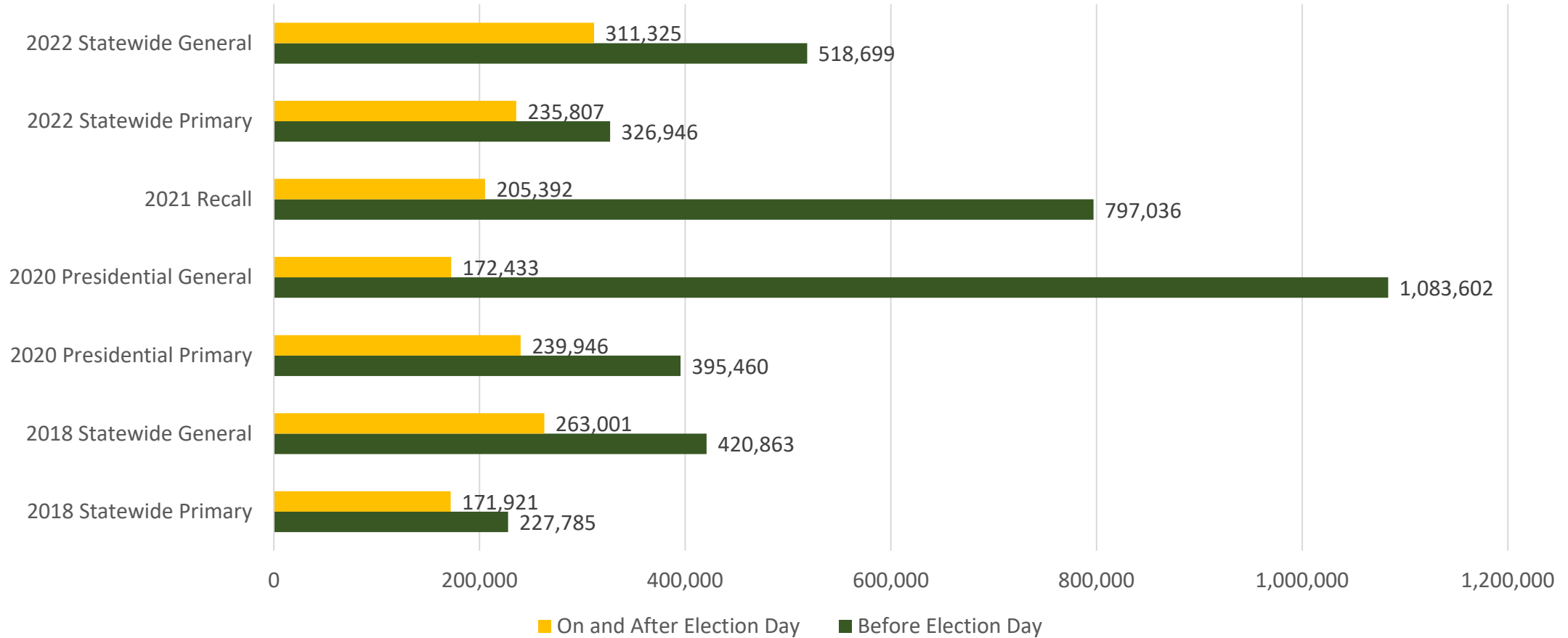






# Vote-By-Mail Trends

# Hand Counting Ballots

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- We must hand count ballots from at least 1 percent of all precincts, randomly selected, to audit results
- Shasta County has 111,000 voters
- Shasta estimates 1,200 people/\$1.65 million needed
- Orange County has 1.8 million voters
- Secretary of State is drafting regulations for a full hand count



# Election Administration Plan

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- First adopted in 2019 and amended in 2021
- 2021 EAP approved by State on Nov. 10, 2021
- 2021 process had 28 social media posts, nine public notices on website, 12 workshops, two 14-day public comment periods, and one public hearing
- Update next required in 2025
